



Eligibility Criteria

- High school Juniors or Seniors currently enrolled in DC Public Schools or DC Public Charter Schools
- Demonstrates an interest in the fields of health sciences, public health, and/or informatics

Application

Both students referred and those expressing interest are required to submit following:

- 1. The PHIT Prep Application accessible through the PHIT4DC.Com website.
- 2. Provide a copy of their most recent academic transcript.
- 3. Submit a letter of recommendation originating from a staff member affiliated with DCPS/DCPCS.
- 4. Deliver a personalized statement detailing why they want to enroll in the PHIT Prep program.





Program Term

The PHIT Program will be a Two-Term Program:

- Term One PHIT Prep 101 September through December
- Term Two PHIT Prep 102 January through May

Grading


Students' final grades are documented as Pass/Fail: Pass - 100% -70% Fail 69% - 0%
